

# NORCO EXTREME MUSTANG TRAIL CHALLENGE

MAY 15-17, 2009

NORCO, CALIFORNIA

Fifty wild Mustangs from the hills of Nevada will be brought to the Bureau of Land Management's Fallon facilities in Ridgecrest, California, Regional Wild Horse and Burro Corrals. The 50 Mustangs will be as uniform in size, age and color as possible.

Fifty approved horse trainers, selected through the Mustang Heritage Foundation will come to the Ridgecrest Regional Wild Horse and Burro Corrals and pick up a pre-assigned (by computer) Mustang on February 13-14, 2009. Trainers must meet all BLM requirements listed below for hauling and stabling their Mustang. The trainers will then take the Mustang home and have until May 15 to train their Mustang and return to the George Ingalls Equestrian Event Center in Norco, California. At

that time the trainers will compete in three areas – 20% on an endurance and body condition score, 40% on a natural trail trial score (held in the arena and on a trail in the foothills) and 40% on a urban trail score (held in downtown Norco). A panel of accomplished horse trainers will determine winners. **More than \$10,000 in cash and prizes will be awarded.**

The participating Mustangs will then be up for adoption through a live bid process on Sunday, May 17, at the George Ingalls Equestrian Event Center in Norco. In addition to prize money, trainers will receive up to \$500 in reimbursement for reasonable training and veterinary expenses and 20% commission on horses adopted for \$200 or more.

## Welcome to Norco

### Thriving Businesses Fund Public Services

While the nationwide and global economic downturn is affecting all sectors of our society, several new and revitalized businesses are contributing to the continuation of public services to our residents. More than most communities, Norco is dependent upon income received from sales tax to provide services such as police, fire, paramedics and parks maintenance. (A little known fact is that property tax revenues account for less than 10% of our City's General Fund income, a number that is far below most cities.) So, successful businesses along Norco's commercial corridors are critical to providing services that contribute to our quality of life. Some of the new successful business ventures in our town are:

- Bob's Big Boy, featuring a statue of "Cowboy Bob" on Hamner Avenue north of Fifth Street, is a quality "sit down" family restaurant and a favorite for young and old alike.
- The new "Gateway to Horsetown" center on Hidden Valley Parkway features Walgreen's, 7-Eleven convenience store and service station, Starbucks, Washington Mutual Bank and other in-line shops.
- The newly redeveloped Chick's Sporting Goods and Floor & Decor stores at Hamner Avenue and Hidden Valley Parkway are proving to be solid additions to an already successful retail center.
- The beautiful new Hampton Inn & Suites on Hamner Avenue near First Street is a welcoming place for visitors to our town.
- A new shopping center to be anchored by Fresh & Easy and Rite Aid stores has been approved on the property at River Road and Second Street. These and other shops and restaurants are expected to line these thoroughfares in place of an existing, outdated strip center. This new retail center will complement and add synergy to the successful existing Stater Bros. center located across the street.
- Boot Barn, Thrifty Horse and other shops in the Norco Country Center on Sixth Street at Temescal Avenue are compatible with Norco's Horsetown USA theme and provide income to pay for services.

Several other new businesses are in the planning stages or on the drawing board, primarily fueled by the prospect of the proposed new 122-acre Silverlakes Equestrian & Sports Park along Hamner Avenue north of the Santa Ana River. This exciting project will greatly benefit our community's tax base and enhance Norco's Horsetown USA lifestyle. In addition to generating income through business activity along our commercial corridors, the City of Norco has been prudent and conservative in its approach to the Budget. During the four-year period prior to the current economic downturn, the City had the foresight to double the General Fund reserves ("rainy day bank account"), which is helping in the current effort to "weather the storm."

A large part of the City's budget strategy has been to reduce spending. This has largely been accomplished through the gradual elimination of more than 20 full-time positions from the City's workforce without compromising service levels. Today, the City's workforce is leaner and more efficient than in the past.

Such efforts to generate additional income and limit spending are critical to the continuation of public services that contribute to our quality of life in Horsetown USA and the animal-keeping lifestyle of our residential neighborhoods.

### Remember to Shop Norco


The number one source of City general fund revenues is sales tax, which provides for City services (police, fire, parks, etc.). Due to the current economic slow-down, sales tax receipts are down significantly. Help provide for these very important services by shopping Norco!



## Norco Hampton Inn Grand Opening



The new Norco Hampton Inn, located at 1530 Hamner Avenue, held a grand opening on October 2, 2008 with over 350 guests in attendance. Hampton Inns are a division of Hilton Hotels Corporation.




The new hotel features 83 guest rooms, a breakfast bar, a meeting room with capacity for 50 people, a gym and a swimming pool. The hotel also features 15 parking stalls to accommodate horse trailers.

The City of Norco benefits from the new Hampton Inn through Transient Occupancy Taxes (TOT Taxes) charged at a rate of 8% on each hotel bill. TOT taxes are not shared with other jurisdictions like sales taxes are. With sales tax, Norco only receives a 1% share of 7.75% added to retail purchases, such as furniture or clothing.



Although not a significant source of revenue yet, TOT taxes are helpful to increase Norco's revenue base with a strategy to diversify and avoid over-reliance on sales taxes from the Norco Auto Mall. The City of Norco is currently preparing a Hotel Demand Study to determine the capacity for more hotels in the community. Along with hotels, other hospitality-related businesses, such as nice restaurants, are likely to follow.

## Sharps Disposal Program

A new law that became effective on September 1, 2008 prohibits the placement of home-generated needles and other “sharps” materials in solid waste and recycling containers. Improperly disposed syringes, hypodermic needles and other sharps materials constitute a serious health hazard to our families and community.

The City of Norco Fire Department has, for some time, provided a sharps disposal program for residents of the City of Norco as a public service. Disposal containers for this service can be obtained by visiting Norco Fire Department Headquarters located at 3902 Hillside Avenue.

The disposal program is limited to residents of the City of Norco only and proof of residency is required. There are different sized containers available depending on the volume of sharps waste that is generated. Once the containers are filled, they are returned to Fire Department Headquarters station where they are picked up and removed for proper disposal.



Local pharmacies also sell disposal containers. The containers are purchased at the pharmacy and when the containers are filled they are placed in a mailing envelope and sent to the disposal company. Some containers are sold with the return postage already included.

Some important safety facts that need to be remembered are:

- Sharps include lancets, hypodermic needles, syringes and scalpel blades.
- Sharps can be contaminated by hepatitis, HIV, tetanus and other diseases.
- Sharps can injure family members and can be a hazard to the workers collecting and sorting waste and recyclables.

Please be safe in the disposal of all sharps materials generated in your home. The law requires you to properly dispose of these materials and the City of Norco provides a free disposal program through the Norco Fire Department. Protect your family, your neighbors, our community, and the workers required to pick up and sort your trash. Please dispose of all sharps materials in the proper way.



## Bulky Waste Pick-up

All Norco residents are entitled to three individual curbside bulky waste pick-ups per year!

- *ALL bulky waste pick-ups (held on Monday only) must be scheduled with Waste Management prior to the pick-up date. Therefore schedule your pick-up with that in mind.*
- *No household hazardous waste, commercial waste, or automobile bodies/parts allowed.*

## Attention Parents: “Lock Your Meds”

Statistics show that over 3 million teens in the United States abuse prescription drugs each year. More startling, 70 percent of children who abuse prescription drugs admit to getting them from friends and family, often taken from the home medicine cabinet without the parents' knowledge. This growing problem of prescription drug abuse, particularly among teens and children, can be effectively stemmed if parents take precautions.

The National Family Partnership has initiated a “Lock Your Meds” campaign to combat the negative impacts prescription drug abuse is having on families. Parents hold the key to their childrens' drug-free future, and awareness of the problem will result in greater family involvement to help to curb this dangerous trend.

The “Lock Your Meds” campaign urges parents to take the following steps to prevent teen prescription drug abuse:

- Lock your prescription medication and prevent abuse or misuse by securing the medication in your home.
- Take inventory of your current medications and periodically check that nothing is missing.
- Educate yourself and your children about the most commonly abused types of prescription medications and communicate the dangers to your child regularly.

- Set clear rules and monitor behavior by expressing your disapproval of using prescription drugs without a prescription.
- Properly dispose of old and unused medications.



### **SELF-CONTROL**

A frazzled mother with a fussy child caught the eye of a grocery store manager. He overheard her say, "Lily, you can do this. We just have to get a few things."

Moments later, when the child became more upset, the mother said calmly, "It's okay, Lily. We're almost done."

When the child became hysterical in the checkout line, the mom took a deep breath and said, "Lily, just hold it together for a few more minutes."

As she was leaving, the store manager stopped her. "I just wanted to compliment you on how remarkably calm and patient you were with little Lily."

The mother laughed. "Well, thank you, but my baby's name is Lisa. I'm Lily. I was just holding it together for myself."

Self-control is a virtue that doesn't come easily. This mother had to work on it, talking herself through each challenge. According to Dr. Daniel Goleman, controlling impulses like frustration and anger is a crucial aspect of character that he calls "emotional intelligence." In fact, he says, "Those who are at the mercy of impulse—who lack self-control—suffer a moral deficiency."

The good news is, this deficiency in self-control can be cured by continuous efforts to identify and overcome negative emotions with rational thought. Although most of us experience negative emotions, inducing us to express anger, give in to frustration, or surrender to temptation, self-control is well within our power. We may not be able to suppress all our emotions and reactions, but we can dictate what we say and do. And whether we'll allow negative feelings to dominate us.

It's hard work to harness powerful impulses and redirect our thoughts toward positive attitudes, but those who do, live happier lives in a happier world.

### Home Improvement Grant

- Home Improvement Grants are available for exterior and/or interior repairs and improvements costing up to \$10,000 for homeowners that are over age 62, or households where the head of household or spouse is handicapped or disabled. The grant is available when repairs or improvements can be completed for under \$10,000. If the Property is sold, refinanced or transferred within one year, one-half the value of the grant would have to be repaid to the Agency.
- If code issues or other health and safety repairs would exceed the \$10,000 grant amount, participants will be required to pay for remaining projects using their own funds, or may participate in the City's Deferred Loan Program.

### S.W.A.T.

**S.W.A.T. is the "Sewer, Water and Trash" discount Program for low income seniors over age 62 and disabled individuals.**

- Seniors over age 62 and disabled individuals are eligible to enroll in the Norco S.W.A.T. Program. This program eliminates the former "Senior Sewer Service Discount" and The "Waste Management Senior Discount" and combines those two programs into one comprehensive Sewer, Water and Trash Discount Program. All three discounts are now in one program and the program is limited to low income households.
- Applicants only have to complete one form for all three discounts and provide income and residency information. Participants will be required to fill out a new application on or about July 1 of each year. If you have any questions, call the Norco Housing Division at (951) 582-5540.
